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

TOP 10 BEST SHOPS TO VISIT

London is a city of shopping – at all ends of the spectrum. Many stores are established but have not lost, or have regained, their cool. Others are new and have quickly made their presence felt on the retail scene. As part of the London Design Festival, there were various one-off 'Pop Up' shops (temporary installations). Notable was Decode London (www.decode-london.com) and Piet Hein Eek's collaboration with Rabih Hage gallery (www.rabih-hage.com), which showcased his amazing angular jugs.

One shopping favourite has to be **Priscilla Cartuccio's Few & Far** (www.fewandfar.net) – a fantastic mix of vintage and artisan products, including a delightful selection of kids' toys. Next up was **Ryantown** (a far cry from Priscilla's Brompton Road emporium) located in the newly fashionable Fiat End, on Columbia Road, home to the famous flower market.

Ryantown is a tiny boutique belonging to artist Rob Ryan – famous for his whimsical cut-out artworks. Luckily, you can also buy online at www.misterrnib.co.uk. **The Conran Shop** (www.conranshop.co.uk) had a very beautiful exhibition to reflect the launch of *Jonas Coussé's Inspiration*. The main theme in this book had been turned into products by designers from around the world, with unexpected and wonderful results.
